ERASMUS CELEBRATES ITS 25TH ANNIVERSARY. ERASMUS: CHANGING LIVES, OPENING MINDS FOR 25 YEARS.

The Erasmus student and staff exchange programme will celebrate its "silver" anniversary in 2012. Erasmus is at the heart of the European Commission's education policy and its strategy to combat the crisis and youth unemployment. Since its launch in 1987, nearly 3 million students and staff have received grants to study or teach abroad or undertake work placements. Studies show that this experience is invaluable for boosting skills in areas such as language learning and adaptability, which can increase an individual's employability. The scheme also helps to promote teaching quality and institutional cooperation. 33 European countries participate in the Erasmus scheme (27 EU Member States, Croatia, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland and Turkey). Demand for Erasmus places strongly exceeds the availability of grants in most countries. The Commission has called for a significant increase in EU support for higher education mobility under its proposed new programme for education, training and youth ('Erasmus for All'), which is due to start in 2014.

In 2007, the University of Granada was awarded the *Golden Star* from the European Commission as the European Higher Education Institution receiving the largest number of international students. Since Granada is one of the favourite destinations for international students (out of almost 80,000 UGR students, 10,000 are international students), the UGR has been chosen to host, on 10th May 2012, the *Erasmus Students Conference*, with the participation of outgoing and incoming Erasmus students, including a reception at the City Hall and a parade through the city of Granada and, on 11th May, the National Conference, *25 years of the Erasmus Programme*, with

representatives from the European Commission, National and Regional Authorities, Spanish Erasmus Ambassadors, Higher Education Institutions and Erasmus Student Network-Spain at the University of Granada.

INFORMATION FOR PARTNER UNIVERSITIES

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LLP/ERASMUS DOCUMENTS.

We would like to inform our European partners that the University of Granada (as many other public administrations in Spain) is currently working on e-administration tools and procedures in order to speed up and facilitate the administrative issues related to the LLP/Erasmus programme. Please note that some official documents from our outgoing students may look different because of this new official administrative treatment. We will introduce an electronic or digital signature on some documents we have to process and work with together:

- o the official learning agreement
- the official LLP/Erasmus Credential

Since this is a new legislative procedure, there will be a co-existence of both, the originally signed and stamped documentation and the official documentation with electronic or digital signature. Please note that the electronic or digital signature affects exclusively the part corresponding to the official UGR signature.

Important dates are:

- Erasmus students wishing to apply for the 1st semester or the full academic year:
 - 1st May to 15th June, 2012: online application and study plan proposal
- Erasmus students wishing to apply for the **2nd semester**:
 - 1st October to 31st October, 2012: online application and study plan proposal

Incoming exchange students (non-erasmus) have also to apply to the UGR online. Important dates are:

- Incoming exchange students wishing to apply for the 1st semester or the full academic year:
 - o **1**st March to **28**th April, **2012**: online application and study plan proposal
- Incoming exchange students wishing to apply for the **2nd semester**:
 - 1st October to 31st October, 2012: online application and study plan proposal

Free mobility incoming students have to apply online during the following dates:

- Free mobility incoming students wishing to apply for the **1**st semester or the full academic year:
 - **18**th **April to 9**th **May, 2012:** online application and study plan proposal
- Free mobility incoming students wishing to apply for the **2**nd semester:
 - 15th October to 5th November, 2012: online application and study plan proposal

INFORMATION RELATED TO LLP/ERASMUS AGREEMENTS OR BILATERAL AGREEMENTS:

In keeping with its internationalisation policy, the Universidad de Granada (UGR) actively promotes entering into agreements of inter-university cooperation with institutions throughout the world on a wide range of academic activities: undergraduate and postgraduate student mobility; teaching staff and researcher mobility; administration and maintenance staff mobility; joint study programmes at undergraduate and postgraduate level; support for promoting the Spanish language abroad; support for developing linguistic skills within the UGR community; establishing lasting networks for collaboration in teaching and research; exchanging experiences and publications; etc.

The process begins with the signing of a draft agreement, after which precise actions are agreed for a determined period of time in a specific agreement. Draft and specific agreement models are available in several languages.

THE UNIVERSITY OF GRANADA PARTICIPATES IN THE MAUNIMO (MAPPING UNIVERSITY MOBILITY) PROJECT:

The **MAUNIMO** (**MA**pping **UNI**versity **Mo**bility - <u>http://www.maunimo.eu/</u>) project aims to present a university perspective on mobility and the related data collection at institutional level. It will provide evidence for the complexity of mobility and allow institutions to dissect the benefits and challenges of mobility that extend beyond national or regionally prescribed quantitative measuring. It will encourage institutions to be proactive in defining their individual approaches regarding mobility, while at the same time managing (and hopefully influencing) the national and regional data collection requirements. Therefore, the project is expected not only to render benefits to institutions, but also to provide insight to national and European policy makers.

EMQT PROJECT - "ERASMUS STRUCTURAL NETWORK":

The EMQT project consists of setting up an "Erasmus structural network", whose general aim is to identify organizational models, good practices, benchmarking procedures and related indicators, which should characterize the quality of the students' exchange mobility. On this basis the project then aims at defining an MQTB-Mobility Quality Tools Box and at developing guidelines for different "Quality patterns or profiles", where a given institution can position itself, and for mechanisms of accountability and of external validation.

The EMQT Quality Tools' Box, which comprises a **Questionnaire**, a General Mapping **Report**, **Guidelines for good practice and a List of useful Indicators**, will hopefully support European Higher Education institutions to self assess their overall quality in the students' exchange.

"Outcomes of the EMQT Project" is the printed Brochure and main outcome of EMQT and contains all the main findings of the two-year project.

Erasmus Mundus is a cooperation and mobility programme in the field of higher education that aims to enhance the quality of European higher education and to promote dialogue and understanding between people and cultures through cooperation with third countries. In addition, it contributes to the development of human resources and the international cooperation capacity of higher education institutions in third countries by increasing mobility between the European Union and these countries.

This Call for Proposals aims to support projects under all three Actions of the programme:
