

## **Implemented international educational programs Erasmus + Al-Farabi Kazakh National University and University of Granada**

The internship will be conducted at the Biomedical Research Center in MiTo lab UGR under the leadership of Luis C. López and Civil Engineering Faculty under the Waste Management / Energy Efficiency program under the supervision of Moscerat Zamorano Toro and from 30.04.2018 to 31.07.2018. This gives PhD doctoral students new opportunities, new knowledge and new skills that will be used for the benefit of the future.
