We will ask participating members of our partner institutions to give a very short presentation (powerpoint, 3 slides maximum, a template will be provided in advance) about their universities and their respective work area.

Library

The library of the University of Konstanz offers more than 2 million volumes of books for staff and students to work with. Library staff will explain how the facilities are organised and which additional resources are available.

Studying international

Universities taking in exchange students from other countries often face a problem regarding the amount of classes offered in a vehicle language (mostly English) for students not fluent in the host country's language. This problem does not arise (to the same extent) in all subject areas and hence solutions could be manifold. In this workshop, we would like to discuss models of how this problem could be solved.

Teaching international

The University of Konstanz fosters international teaching visits and encourages its academic staff to go abroad and teach in partner institutions. In this workshop we would like to discuss the challenges involved in organising teaching mobilities and present our best practice concept.

Individual programme/Thematic round tables

For this session we will organise round tables with staff from other divisions involved in international affairs. Last year's round tables included staff from the International Office, the Welcome Center, other academic Departments, Seezeit (student housing organisation), and the Higher Education Didactics Office.
