Share and analyze successful communication strategies used by International Relations Offices to engage and support students.

• Internationalization Beyond Mobility

Discover opportunities for academic cooperation beyond student exchange, such as International academic cooperation projects.

Managing Erasmus+ KA171 Mobility Projects

Gain insights into the administration of KA171 projects, with a special focus on resolving doubts and supporting new partners.

• Evaluating Transparency in the Administration of Grant Programs

Share and analyze good practices used by International Relations Offices to ensure a fair, transparent and equitable grant management.

European Alliances Initiative

Examine the impact of European University Alliances, with a case study on the transformative role of the Arqus Alliance at the University of Granada.

• Emergency Management in International Mobility

Understand the structure of the Vice-Rectorate for Internationalization and review protocols for managing emergencies during mobility periods.

Additional Activities:

To complement the academic sessions, participants will have the opportunity to take part in **cultural activities**, such as **guided visits to historical buildings**, offering a deeper insight into the cultural and historical context of the host city and fostering informal networking among attendees.
